Through LEAP (see DAFI 36-4005), the Air Force Culture and Language Center develops a highly capable, motivated, agile inventory of Airmen and Guardians from across the General-Purpose Force (GPF) who provide the connective tissue that bridges language and cultural barriers with allies and partners to create a more interoperable, lethal force prepared for agile combat employment. Language + Culture= Speed
