Mr. David Scott is the Vice Commandant and Director of Education, Air Force First Sergeant Academy, Maxwell-Gunter Air Force Base, Alabama. In these roles, he serves as the principle advisor to the first sergeant academy commandant, major command, and component first sergeant functional managers on all matters involving the development, training, and education of over 700 newly-selected first sergeants per year. The academy administers a demanding course focused on preparing active duty, guard, and reserve first sergeants to be key advisors to commanders on the readiness, health, morale, and welfare of Airmen and families across the Air Force.

Mr. Scott was raised in Century, Florida. He entered the Air Force in July 1987 as a Fuel Systems Apprentice. During his career, he held various positions within aircraft maintenance that included Production Superintendent for fighter and cargo aircraft. Following a diverse career in maintenance, Mr. Scott was selected and served as a first sergeant for 8 years, after which, in 2013, he removed his diamond after being selected to stand up the Chief Leadership Course. Mr. Scott served as Director of the Chief Leadership Course until his retirement in 2016 with more than 29 years of service. His assignments have included bases in Florida, Germany, Texas, and Alabama. Mr. Scott has also deployed to Uganda, Saudi Arabia, Turkey, Bahrain, Qatar, and Iraq in support of Operations DESERT SHIELD, DESERT STORM, ENDURING FREEDOM, and IRAQI FREEDOM.
