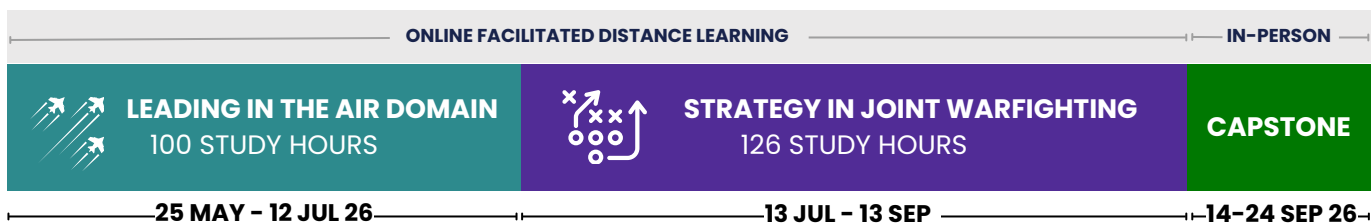


Agile Air Command and Staff College (ACSC) is a **blended** learning IDE and JPME I modality offering a new way to deliver PME for non-resident students. It combines instructor-facilitated, **interdisciplinary** online courses culminating with a two-week, in-person Capstone. Students will experience an enriched learning environment, peer networking, and the opportunity to grow skills they and their commanders can use immediately through the application of leadership, airpower, national security, and joint planning concepts in a practical, mission-relevant setting.

Why Agile ACSC?

Air Force Global College recognizes that not all adults learn the same way. Agile ACSC was designed for the non-resident student to capitalize on the best practices of online and in-person learning to offer the “reps and sets” needed to build skills that apply in both strategic scenarios and daily operational environments. Unlike traditional distance learning, Agile ACSC gives students a structured, accelerated, cohort-based opportunity to earn IDE and JPME I credit in four and a half months.
