Colonel Andrew Swartzter is the Vice Commandant at the Global College of Professional Military Education (GCPME), Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama. GCPME is responsible for leading Community College of the Air Force (CCAF), Civilian Leadership Development School (CLDS), and all Officer and Enlisted Distance Learning Professional Military Education programs, representing more than 450,000 USAF Active Duty, Guard and Reserve, DAF Civilian, and Sister Service students, and more than 7,000 faculty.

Colonel Swartzter was commissioned through the Reserve Officer Training Corps at Auburn University in 1998 where he graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Biomedical Sciences. He has served as a Missile Combat Crew Commander in the Minuteman III Intercontinental Ballistic Missile System, Satellite Vehicle Operator in the Global Positioning System and as Executive Officer to the United States Strategic Command J7. He has held a variety of Joint Training and United States Air Force Professional Military Education Assignments. In 2020, he earned his Doctor of Philosophy Degree in History of Technology where he graduated with distinction and received the 2021 Auburn University Distinguished Dissertation Award. Prior to his current position, he was an Assistant Professor and the Associate Dean of Education for Operations/A3 at the Air Command and Staff College, Maxwell Air Force Base, AL.
