LIEUTENANT GENERAL ANDREA D. TULLOS

Lt Gen Andrea D. Tullos is Commander and President, Air University, Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama. She provides full spectrum education, research and outreach at every level through professional military education, professional continuing education, and academic degree granting. She leads the intellectual and leadership development center of the U.S. Air Force, graduating more than 50,000 resident and 120,000 non-resident officers, enlisted and civilian personnel each year. Additionally, she is responsible for officer commissioning through Officer Training School and the Reserve Officer Training Corps.

Lt Gen Tullos entered the Air Force in 1991 and received her commission through Officer Training School as a distinguished graduate. She is a career Security Forces officer and has previously served as a staff officer at the combatant command, Joint Staff, Air Staff and major command levels and as the Director of Security Forces, Headquarters U.S. Air Force. She has completed multiple command tours at the squadron, group, wing and numbered Air Force level.



CHIEF MASTER SERGEANT STEFAN D. BLAZIER

Chief Stefan Blazier is the Command Chief Master Sergeant for Air University, Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama. Air University is the intellectual and leadership-development center for the Air Force and Space Force, providing a full-spectrum of courses that graduate more than 50,000 resident and 120,000 non-resident officers, enlisted and civilian personnel each year to achieve national security objectives. He serves as the adviser to the Air University commander on all matters affecting the quality, welfare, morale, readiness and leadership of service members assigned to more than 1,300 locations around the world.

Chief Blazier enlisted in the Air Force as an imagery analyst in the Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance community. His experience includes a wide range of operational, training and developmental roles and missions. Chief Blazier has held various senior enlisted positions at squadron, group, wing, center and headquarters levels.



MAJOR GENERAL PARKER H. WRIGHT

Maj Gen Parker H. Wright is the Commander, Curtis E. LeMay Center for Doctrine Development and Education, and Deputy Commander, Air University, Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama. The Center advances warfighting through doctrine, education and training, while Air University serves as the intellectual and leadership-development center of the Air Force.

Maj Gen Wright commissioned in 1996 as a distinguished graduate of the U.S. Air Force Academy. He is a career intelligence officer with a variety of operational assignments, including squadron, group, wing, and joint commands. Maj. Gen. Wright has deployed in support of air operations over Iraq, Afghanistan, and the Balkans. The general's staff assignments include Headquarters U.S. Air Force, U.S. Air Forces Europe, and the Joint Staff. Maj Gen Wright holds advanced degrees from the Harvard Kennedy School of Government and the School of Advanced Air and Space Studies and was a National Defense Fellow at the Center for a New American Security.



Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary STANLEY L. BROWN

Stanley L. Brown is the Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary for the Bureau of Political-Military Affairs. He previously served as Acting Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Political-Military Affairs from January 1 to May 6, 2022. From January 2020 to January 2021, he served as PM's Deputy Assistant Secretary for Programs and Operations, and from July 2013 to January 2020, Mr. Brown served as the Director of the Office of Weapons Removal and Abatement in the PM Bureau.

Before joining the Department of State, he served 27 years in the U.S. Air Force as a pilot primarily in Special Operations units but also in assignments at the Department of State to include Director of the Office of International Security Operations, Bureau of Political-Military Affairs and Special Operations Chief in the Office of Counterterrorism. He has a B.A. from the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill and an M.S. from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University. He is a graduate of Squadron Officer School, Air Command and Staff College, and Air War College.



BRIGADIER GENERAL GEOFFREY F. WEISS

Brig Gen Geoffrey F. Weiss is the Director of Regional Affairs for the Deputy Under Secretary of the Air Force, International Affairs, the Pentagon, Arlington, Virginia. In this role, he manages relationships and provides oversight and guidance for international programs supporting national security objectives through politico-military affairs, security assistance, education, training and cooperative research and development. Brig Gen Weiss supervises over 3,400 foreign military sales cases valued at more than \$266 billion.

Brig Gen Weiss is a Master Air Battle Manager with more than 2,500 hours in the E-3 Sentry including 335 hours of combat and combat support. Brig Gen Weiss is also an award-winning author with articles appearing in the Joint Force Quarterly and Air and Space Power Journal; and his bestselling book, "The New Art of War: The Origins, Theory, and Future of Conflict," was published by Cambridge University Press in 2021.



U.S. Ambassador to Ecuador Michael Fitzpatrick

A career diplomat, Michael J. Fitzpatrick arrived in Quito in June 2019 to begin service as U.S. Ambassador to Ecuador. Prior Senior Foreign Service stints include service as Deputy Assistant Secretary for Western Hemisphere Affairs; Interim U.S. Permanent Representative to the Organization of American States and the United States Coordinator for the 2015 Summit of the Americas; Deputy Chief of Mission and Chargé d'Affaires, a.i. in Lima, Peru; and as Foreign Policy Advisor to the Chief of the National Guard Bureau, a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Fitzpatrick also served as Deputy Chief of Mission in Asunción, Paraguay.

Ambassador Fitzpatrick joined the U.S. Foreign Service in 1988, after first joining the State Department as a Presidential Management Fellow in 1986. He holds a Bachelor's degree from Georgetown University and a Master's in International Affairs (International Security Policy) from the School of Public and International Affairs at Columbia University.

The senior mentor will be available throughout the seminar, and will offer viewpoints, advice and perspectives for all the topics discussed.


LIEUTENANT GENERAL (ret) ALLEN G. PECK

He led the intellectual and leadership center of the Air Force, graduating more than 50,000 resident and 120,000 non-resident officers, enlisted and civilian personnel each year. Additionally, he was responsible for officer commissioning through Officer Training School and the Reserve Officer Training Corps.

Following retirement from active duty in 2011, he spent 3 years as the Director of the Air Force Research Institute (2013-2016) and as a faculty member at the Air Command and Staff College.






