COMMANDER'S CORNER: LeMay Center Command Roll-up

LeMay Center Hosts JASDF Delegation

Air University and the Curtis E. LeMay Center for Doctrine Development and Education hosted a delegation from the Japan Air Self-Defense Force (JASDF) Air and Space Studies Institute (JASI) for a collaborative engagement focused on exchanging knowledge and best practices in doctrine development, lessons learned processes, and wargaming techniques.

During the visit, the LeMay Center outlined their missions and visions and discussed examining disruptive technologies to prevent future doctrinal surprises, avoid doctrinal stagnation, and expedite doctrinal evolution to match the accelerated pace of technological change. The engagement fostered a valuable exchange of ideas and perspectives.

Both JASI and the LeMay Center teams expressed a mutual appreciation for the opportunity to share best practices, discuss challenges, and explore potential areas for future collaboration. Both entities are looking forward to future opportunities to work together to improve processes and programs.

COMMANDER'S CORNER: LeMay Center Command Roll-up

The U.S. Space Force hosted the Schriever Wargame Capstone (SW) 2025 from August 10-21 at the LeMay Center's Air Force Wargaming Institute at Maxwell Air Force Base. Over 350 participants from the U.S. Department of Defense, industry, and nine partner nations convened to explore strategic challenges within a future conflict scenario. SW 25 was an operational wargame set a decade in the future, presenting players with a notional conflict where they tested strategies, policies, and the potential of advanced technologies to bolster coalition operations. Colonel Shannon DaSilva, Space Delta 10 commander, explained that the wargame allowed U.S. and international air and space forces to assess the implications of their decisions in a fast-paced scenario. Participants examined whether existing policies and proposed capabilities would hold up in a conflict and explored what technological advancements would be beneficial in such situations.



This process aided in informing future force design and acquisitions, ensuring the U.S. and its allies remain a formidable fighting force. According to Col DaSilva, SW 25 prompted participants to consider desirable future capabilities, policies, and interoperability. Guardians were joined by space professionals from other military branches, commercial industry, and partner nations under the Combined Space Operations initiative. This international collaboration aimed to advance shared concepts, enhance mutual security and interoperability in space, and utilize SW 25 as a controlled environment to test cooperative frameworks and policy options.

COMMANDER'S CORNER: LeMay Center Command Roll-up

Col DaSilva emphasized the importance of wargames like Schriever in fostering collaboration among like-minded nations to stay ahead of potential threats. She stated the wargame provided senior leaders with a clearer understanding of potential space conflicts and the requirements for deterrence, with the ultimate goal of informing smarter decisions today to prevent real-world conflicts tomorrow. Planning for the Schriever Wargame began in 1998, with the inaugural event taking place in 2001. The lessons learned over the years have shaped current policies and continue to guide future international space operations planning. Col DaSilva noted that partner nations were increasingly arriving at the Schriever Wargame with more space knowledge and targeted questions, emphasizing the enduring value of the wargame in allowing participants to see the real-time impacts of their decisions.

In July of 2025, SOS launched a completely revamped course emphasizing warfighter ethos, increasing knowledge and application of the Air Force Planning Process, and increasing familiarity and preparedness to execute the Deployable Wing Construct.

The new approach emphasizes experiential learning in a four-week course to cement A-Staff and Units of Action roles, responsibilities, and command relationships in a scenario-driven, student led progressive model, aligning curriculum with the Air Force's Force Generation (AFFORGEN) deployment model.
