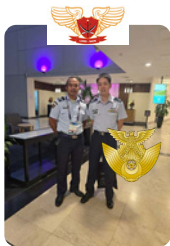

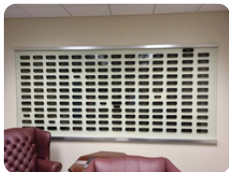
The **International Honor Roll (IHR)** recognizes international Professional Military Education graduates of Air University who have achieved distinguished positions of leadership within their respective nations.

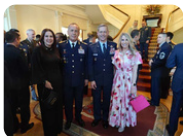

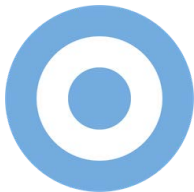

GLOBALLY ALIGNED; REGIONALLY FOCUSED

BLUF: The United States projects influence, builds partner capacity, and maintains global stability through a highly integrated network of diplomatic and military organizations. The State Department sets the political and foreign policy agenda, while Geographic Combatant Commands (GCCs) execute military operations and regional security strategies. The Defense Security Cooperation Agency (DSCA), the State Partnership Program (SPP), and DoD Regional Centers act as the critical connective tissue, synchronizing funding, tactical partnerships, and strategic education across these regions.

The State Department (DOS): Diplomatic & Political Lead

The State Department is the lead agency for the formulation and execution of US foreign policy.

- **Regional Organization:** DOS is organized into regionally focused bureaus (e.g., Bureau of African Affairs, Bureau of European and Eurasian Affairs) that manage bilateral and multilateral relations.
- **Interaction:** Politically, DOS interacts through embassies and consulates. The US Ambassador (Chief of Mission) leads the "Country Team" and holds authority over all US executive branch personnel in the host country, except for military personnel assigned to a GCC commander. For military aid, the DOS Bureau of Political-Military Affairs ensures that defense initiatives align with broader bilateral and regional foreign policy goals and concurs on capacity-building projects.



GLOBALY ALIGNED; REGIONALLY FOCUSED

Geographic Combatant Commands (GCCs): Military & Operational Lead

The Department of Defense (DoD) divides the globe into specific Areas of Responsibility (AORs) managed by Geographic Combatant Commands.

- Regional Organization: The six GCCs are USNORTHCOM (North America), USSOUTHCOM (Latin America/Caribbean), USEUCOM (Europe/Eurasia), USAFRICOM (Africa), USCENTCOM (Middle East/Central Asia), and USINDOPACOM (Indo-Pacific).
- Interaction: Militarily, GCCs develop Theater Security Cooperation Plans and are responsible for the multi-year planning of joint exercises, military engagements, and capacity-building projects for the countries in their theater.

They coordinate directly with partner nations' militaries to deter threats and ensure regional stability.

Defense Security Cooperation Agency (DSCA): The Synchronizer

DSCA manages and executes global security cooperation programs, acting as the bridge between DoD, DOS, and the GCCs.

- Regional Organization: DSCA oversees Security Cooperation Organizations (SCOs) embedded within US embassies worldwide, placing logistics and management experts directly in the region.
- Interaction: DSCA directs programs like Foreign Military Sales (FMS), Foreign Military Financing (FMF), and International Military Education and Training (IMET).

When a GCC plans a Train-and-Equip mission, DSCA oversees the logistics, financial management, and program execution, while ensuring the DOS concurs with the political implications.



GLOBALY ALIGNED; REGIONALLY FOCUSED

State Partnership Program (SPP): State-Level Strategic Bridges

Administered by the National Guard Bureau, the SPP pairs specific US state National Guards with partner nations' defense ministries and security forces.

- **Regional Organization:** The SPP maintains over 100 partnerships globally.

For example, the Illinois National Guard partners with Portugal, and the Oregon National Guard partners with Vietnam.

- **Interaction:** SPP conducts military-to-military and civil-military engagements, such as disaster response training, cyber defense collaboration, and co-deployments.

These activities are guided by DOS foreign policy goals and executed to support the overarching security objectives of the regional GCC and the US Chief of Mission.



DoD Regional Centers for Security Studies: Academic & Inter-Ministerial Engagement

Authorized under Title 10, these centers are executive-level academic institutions managed by DSCA.

- **Regional Organization:** There are six centers tailored to specific geographies:
 - George C. Marshall Center: Europe
 - Daniel K. Inouye Center: Asia-Pacific
 - William J. Perry Center: Western Hemisphere / Americas
 - Africa Center for Strategic Studies: Africa
 - Near East-South Asia (NESA) Center: Middle East and South Asia
 - Ted Stevens Center: Arctic
- **Interaction:** Politically and militarily, they serve as international venues for bilateral and multilateral research, communication, and executive education.

They target a senior-level audience (O-5/GS-14 equivalent and above), including parliamentarians and officials from ministries of defense, foreign affairs, and justice, to promote shared responses to transnational threats.

GLOBALLY ALIGNED; REGIONALLY FOCUSED

The US How They Interact: A Unified Regional Approach

Organization	Primary Role	Political vs. Military	Key Inter-Agency Interaction
State Dept (DOS)	Foreign Policy & Diplomacy	Political	Concurs on DoD security assistance; leads Embassy Country Teams.
GCCs	Theater Security & Operations	Military	Plans regional military strategy; coordinates with DOS for country access.
DSCA	Security Cooperation Execution	Military & Political	Synchronizes funding and program logistics between OSW, DOS, and GCCs.
SPP	Long-term tactical/strategic partnerships	Military & Civil	Matches US States to foreign nations; operations approved by GCCs and DOS.
Regional Centers	Strategic Education & Networking	Military & Political	Fosters inter-ministerial alliances; supports GCC regional strategies.

These entities form a cohesive ecosystem. For example, if a partner nation requires counter-terrorism capability, the DOS approves the political relationship, the regional GCC determines the military requirements, DSCA funds and procures the equipment, the SPP may provide the National Guard trainers to conduct the hands-on instruction, and the Regional Centers will engage the nation's senior civilian and military leaders in strategic dialogue to ensure long-term stability.
