DERRICK V. FRAZIER

Dr. Derrick V. Frazier is Deputy Commandant and Professor of Strategy and Security Studies at the School of Advanced Air and Space Studies (SAASS), Air University (AU), Maxwell Air Force Base (AFB), Alabama. SAASS is a selective one-year graduate school for strategists with 16 terminally credentialed faculty and 45 Air Force, Department of Defense, and international students. As part of the faculty, he is responsible for creating warrior-scholars who have a superior ability to develop, evaluate, and employ airpower as a component of military force in support of national objectives. Dr. Frazier currently serves as the Director of the AU and Faculty development PhD programs in addition to serving as Director of the SAASS Space Power course.

His areas of expertise include strategy, security studies, regional powers and security orders, space security and multinational doctrine development. Dr. Frazier's publications include a book, *Regional Powers and Security Orders* (Routledge, 2012), as well as a variety of peer-reviewed articles from such journals as *The European Journal of International Relations, International Interactions* and *Foreign Policy Analysis*. Dr. Frazier's most recent work includes research articles in *Defence Studies* and the *RUSI Journal* on socialization through military doctrine, as well as applied work on doctrine development with the Nigerian Armed Forces and Cameroonian Air Force as a United States Air Forces in Europe and United States Air Forces Africa (USAFE-AFAFICA) subject matter expert.



Dr. Frazier holds a PhD in Political Science from the University of Arizona as well as a MA in International Studies from North Carolina State University and a BA in Anthropology from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.
