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DIRECTOR'S INTRODUCTON

In 2022, the Air University Teaching and Learning Center (AUTLC) focused on expanding our accessibility for the entire Air University and Air Education and Training Command communities. The data shared in this report reflects our efforts to reach faculty and students at their point-of-need, no matter where in the world they are geographically located or where they currently are in their own learning progression.

One successful example of this is the 2022 launch of the fully online, self-paced Teaching Essentials Course (TEC). This foundational faculty development course enables learners to choose their own learning path based on 14 instructor competencies. Competencies focus on the foundations of adult learning, instructional design, student-centered instruction using active learning strategies in an inclusive manner, and evaluation and reflection. This year alone, we enrolled 103 students from across 61 different organizations, and we welcome new learners for 2023!

Additionally, we reached 39 different organizations through nearly 100 consultations on educational technology and its purposeful use in the military learning environment. As we begin the next year, we are prioritizing research into and faculty development efforts for immersive learning technologies.

The AUTLC's research portfolio also includes analysis of effective instructional strategies such as problem-based learning. This year we partnered with scholars from National Defense University, Marine Corps University, the Department of State, and the U.S. Army War College to publish findings specific to developing officers' communication skills in an edited volume with Air University Press (https://www.airuniversity.af.edu/Portals/10/AUPress/Books/B 177 Hennessy Developing Military Leadership.pdf). A second volume is forthcoming, exploring similar topics for the enlisted force.

The AUTLC also has its finger on the pulse of conversations around wargaming. We stood up the Educational Wargaming Network this year, a comprehensive community of interest for military educators. Join us for quarterly discussions and resource sharing.

Finally, our Writing Lab continues to be at the fore of student support at Air University. Many thanks to our volunteer faculty tutors who, together with our Lead Writing Specialist Ms. Meg Varney, assisted an impressive 773 students in tutoring appointments this year.

In 2023, we'll continue to prioritize direct support to faculty, students, and staff across all of Air University—it is our honor to serve you!







Other programming


- New in 2022: offered in-person and virtual drop-in hours for resident students
