Air University Faculty Knowledge Online



Air University Faculty Knowledge Online (AFKO) is a series of hour-long virtual presentations to assist, inform, and develop faculty members. These online learning events are open to any AU faculty member and are recorded for later viewing.

AFKO presentations focus on various aspects of faculty duties (teaching, scholarship, and academic service), policies, and opportunities. Any member of AU can volunteer to give an AFKO presentation or recommend a topic that is applicable to the faculty at large.

Currently, AFKO presentations are conducted using "[Microsoft Office 365 Teams](#)," every Thursday at 1400. An AFKO channel has been established in Teams, where faculty can find notices, presentations (live and recorded), and other resources.

AFKO began as a partnership between AU's Directorates of Academic Affairs and Academic Services, and has since expanded to include the Faculty Senate. A small steering committee now schedules, publicizes, provides tech support, and records/archives sessions. Any AU faculty member who would like to assist is welcome to join the committee.
