


Director of the Leadership Communication Skills Center at Marine Corps University to co-present a session exploring the lessons learned and questions raised in the transition from civilian to military writing centers.

Teaching Essentials Course

Plan a Workshop. In the past three months, the TEC team has conducted several workshops serving over 80 instructors from across Air University. Gamification and Teaching Strategies are the most popular requests. After receiving a request, the team sets up an initial meeting to gather specific information about the

participants and their goals. Then, the team works with the coordinator to determine the theme, an appropriate length for the workshop



along with a date and time. Depending on the focus, lesson plans and assignments are sent in advance to make discussions and examples more relevant and to ensure the activities are directly applicable. Customized workshops are created using lessons from the Teaching Essentials Course.
